What you need to bring to your Summer Welcome session:

- ☑ myZou student number (Eight digits)
- ☑ Copies of your transcripts or other documentation of course credit if not previously submitted to Admissions
- Photo ID such as a driver's license or passport (you will have your picture taken for your Mizzou TigerCard, the MU ID card, and government issued identification is required)
- ☑ Completed immunization documentation if not previously sent to MU Student Health
- ☑ Casual clothes including comfortable walking shoes
- \square Water bottle(s)
- 🗹 Umbrella
- 🗹 Laptop, configured on Day 2 (or in the afternoon of one-day sessions) for the campus network (Optional)
- ☑ Academic Guide worksheet (please see below for details)

If you are staying on campus during your Summer Welcome session:

- ☑ Bathrobe and shower shoes (residence halls have separate community bathrooms for men and women)
- Personal toiletries (MU will provide towels and bed linens)

Parking:

Parking permits are now electronic, utilizing your license plate number. A link will be included in your confirmation email for you to submit your vehicle information online. If you are renting a vehicle, we will also have this link at check-in and you may register your vehicle at that time.

Transportation:

If you are traveling by car, there is a map and directions under Quick Links on newstudent.missouri.edu. If you are traveling by air, Columbia is approximately two and a half hours from the Kansas City airport, and two hours from the St. Louis Airport. Shuttle service to and from the Kansas City and St. Louis Airports are available through MO-X at (877) 669-4826 or www.moexpress.com. Transportation to and from the Columbia Regional Airport is offered through local taxi companies.

Lodging:

It is our expectation that all students spend the night in campus residence halls. Remember, your roommate during Summer Welcome will be a student living in the same residence hall or neighborhood as you starting in the fall. This overnight experience is a very important part of Summer Welcome for all new students. Math and Foreign Language Placement Exams (MMT must be completed by April 1):

The math department uses the MyMathTest (MMT) from Pearson Publishing as a tool to evaluate math ability. MMT, an online assessment that covers a variety of pre-calculus topics, zeros in on the strengths and weaknesses of your current mathematical knowledge. Understanding your current ability level is critical to placing you in an appropriate math course at Mizzou. To find out if the MMT assessment is required for you, visit mathplacement.missouri.edu.

All students will have the opportunity to take the MU Foreign Language placement exam online. This exam can be accessed through our website at newstudent.missouri.edu under the Quick Links section. You will need your myZou username and password.

Partial Schedule/Academic Worksheet:

In mid-May, you will receive the Academic Guide to Summer Welcome. This booklet will help you prepare for your appointment with an academic advisor. Please complete the academic worksheet enclosed in the Academic Guide and bring it with you to Summer Welcome. The booklet will also include instructions on viewing the partial course schedule that you have been signed up for based upon the information you submitted with your Summer Welcome reservation. Your partial course schedule will be available in early June. Please note, these courses are not final until you meet with your advisor during Summer Welcome.

Pets Permitted on Grounds, Not in Buildings:
